








	Development Services Agency 800.282.0880	Assists with completing applications for <i>Home Energy Assistance Program</i> (HEAP) - utilities help based on income, <i>Percentage of Income Payment Plan</i> (PIPP) - extended payment service based on income, and <i>Home Weatherization Assistance Program</i> .
	Franklin County Department of Job & Family Services 614.233.2000	Emergency assistance with rent, utilities, and disabled vehicle once per 12 months; must either have a pregnant woman who has no minor children <u>or</u> one minor in the household to qualify. Must have verifiable income unless individual qualifies for a Housing Choice voucher.
	IMPACT 614.252.2799	Assists completing HEAP and PIPP applications. Serves specific Columbus zipcodes.
	J.O.I.N. 614.241.2530	Maximum \$50/year for current utilities bills only. Call for rental assistance to verify availability of funds and eligibility. Phone line available from 11 a.m.-12 p.m. and 1-2 p.m.

 Homelessness	HandsOn Central Ohio 1.888.4.SHELTR (1.888.474.3587)	Triages those who are homeless or in danger of becoming homeless. Also assists with food pantry scheduling. Has an extensive Franklin County resource data base. (Note: 11 a.m.-1 p.m. and 5-5:30 p.m. are good times to call.)



	COTA - Bus Transportation 614.275.5828	\$62 unlimited monthly bus pass or a \$4.50 unlimited day pass; 50% discount to rides 65 and older, disabled, Medicare card or VA disability. Project Mainstream available for those who meet requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act.
	J.O.I.N. 614.241.2530	Up to \$20 assistance for bus passes or gasoline. Phone line available from 11 a.m.-12 p.m. and 1-2 p.m.
	Medicaid Cab Services Phone number listed on Medicaid card	If the individual has a Medicaid Managed Care Plan (i.e. CareSource, Molina, Buckeye, Paramount or United Healthcare Medicaid) they are eligible for 15 free round trip cab rides to and from their doctor, WIC or Medicaid re-determination appointments. Medicaid will also send bus passes instead of cabs if preferred (give as much notice as possible).

	Medicaid and Medicare Insurance Plans	Medicaid —If enrolled in Medicaid and has a Managed Care Plan “MCP” (i.e. CareSource, Molina, United Healthcare, Buckeye or Paramount) they should have dental coverage. The key is finding providers who accept the MCP. This can be done through each MCP’s individual website; you can narrow down your search by zip code and by type of service desired. Medicare — Medicare typically does not cover dental services unless the patient is enrolled in a supplemental plan. OSHIP has a hotline dedicated to help people with Medicare understand their coverage—1-800-686-1578.
 Vision	Faith Mission 614.224.6617 ext. 2107	Serves the homeless living in Faith shelters or others referred by public or non-profit agencies.
	Stowe Baptist 614.445.8400	Eye exams with voucher for glasses; donations requested.
	Vineyard Community Church - Reynoldsburg 740.927.7729	Free eye exams and limited eyeglasses available.
	Vineyard Free Health Clinics 614.259.5428	Free exams. Information provided for obtaining discounted glasses, Must be uninsured, no Medicare or Medicaid and at 200% poverty level.

 Prescriptions	The Breathing Association 614.457.4570	Helps people 55 years and over with medications pertaining to lung disease, diabetes, heart and mental illness. Maximum \$250 in assistance over the past 6 months.
	Charitable Pharmacy of Central Ohio, Inc. 614-227-0301	Helps Franklin County residents with limited income get free medication as available. There are no walk-in appointments.
	J.O.I.N. 614.241.2531	No more than \$50 paid directly to the pharmacy for medical supplies or prescription medicines, no opiate pain medications or over the counter drugs are covered.
	Needy Meds 800.503.6897	National non-profit helping people locate assistance programs to help them afford their medications and other healthcare costs.
	Partnership for Prescription Assistance 888.477.2669	FREE clearinghouse for many public and private patient assistance programs including the ones offered by drug companies for brand name and generic medicines; helps find free or nearly-free prescription medicines. Also helps patients contact government programs such as Medicaid, Medicare and SCHIP and assists Medicare beneficiaries with information about the Medicare Prescription Drug Benefit (Part D).
